

John loved to cook and at the last Illiana meeting he brought a casserole that he was very proud of. His wife Becky had told him to cut back on the garlic, as those people will not want as much as he did. The casserole was very good and only a small portion remained. He offered the remains to Carol and she told him he should take it home for his lunch the next day, so he did.

At the Illiana meetings John was usually standing near the rear of the room as it was crowded at most meetings. Remember the man with the beard, a big smile and always had on a red or white tee shirt? That was Big John.

John was laid to rest on August 27<sup>th</sup>, with the Rocky Forge's newly ordained minister, Jim Keith, performing the service. One of our IBA miniature anvils carefully placed in the coffin with him. Burial was August 29<sup>th</sup> near Marion, Indiana.

The next meeting of the Rocky Forge group will be at Ted's shop on September 10, starting with coffee and doughnuts at 8:30. Lunch will be blank, blank and blank, so bring something to go with it!
