Next Meeting: 10/8/2016

On Wednesday, October 12th, the Illiana Antique Power Association (Illiana) will host several hundred 4th graders for what is called "History Day" at the Rainsville show grounds. This event is a very popular and important outing for the children of the Benton, Fountain and Warren County Schools. During their visit we expect to have over 30 stations of active demonstrations going for the kids to learn about life in Indiana 100 years ago. This year the event has been recognized by the State Bicentennial Committee as an official bicentennial event. The bicentennial torch will pass through the grounds while the kids are there, so, with that in mind a large crowd of dignitaries and spectators is expected.

The Rocky Forge group will play a significant role in this event. Letters from past 4th graders who have attended previous History Day events demonstrates how important and impressive the blacksmiths were to these kids. In other words you guys made a great impression about blacksmithing, cooperage, and the Lewis and Clark adventure. We must strive to keep that interest alive and well for the future events.

It's not all about going to someone's shop and having fun then forgetting about it till next month and having fun again. We each must do our part to support the group.

After all said and done we should have ample time to do some forging on Saturday. So bring your tools, metal and some coal.

Several Illiana folks will be on the grounds Saturday for cleanup. It would be nice for us to assist them wherever possible. Carol has volunteered to prepare hamburgers and hot dogs for both the Rocky Forge group and the Illiana workers on Saturday. We are asking you and others to bring a dish to share. If someone would like to assist Carol that would also be good. Thank you all for whatever you can do.
