Bite-Sized Knowledge

This space I intend to be educational. I will start with the most basic subjects and build up. Any subject that you would like to see addressed can be covered. Fire for your iron

In order to mold iron without tons of force it has to be heated. The fuel, discussed last month, is burned to provide that heat. When oxygen meets other materials that have the correct chemical properties and enough energy the oxygen combines with them and produces fire. How much heat depends on what the material is and how much material and oxygen is present. In your forge there is always much more fuel than oxygen until you start the blower. The more air blown in the more fuel burned and the more heat. Specifics next time-out of time this time.
