

Wire Wheel Safety

Portable and bench wire wheels that we use on a routine basis to clean or buff metal are **very dangerous tools**. There are hundreds of ways to get hurt with a wire wheel, as one of our members recently discovered. Some of us own unsafe wire wheels in pairs mounted on a belt-driven shaft as pictured below.



This arrangement is dangerous because the clothing or fingers can be pulled into the belt. Even worse, clothing or fingers can be pulled into or abraded by the rapidly rotating wire wheel. Worse yet, since the wheels shown have no tool rest or guard, the metal piece being brushed can be pulled out of your hands, travel around the wheel and fly off in the direction of your body, face, eyes or, as one of our members found out, forehead. This type of injury is pictured below.



I recommend that you put guards on the belt and around each wheel and wear a full face shield.
